As always we started the new year with much success and hard work at Dame Allan's. For pupils in Years 11-13 this meant trial examinations and I have been pleased to note the hard work which went in to producing many pleasing results. Examination results were also brought to mind when the Department for Education published its league tables in January. Whilst we welcome the opportunity to highlight our results, league tables should always form part of an informed view. We certainly feel that the GCSE information published does not provide an accurate picture of our performance and the hard work of our pupils and staff as the table does not include Dame Allan's chosen IGCSE qualifications in Maths, English, German and History. This meant that, in the year when our GCSE results were the best in the Schools' history, an obviously skewed result of zero per cent of our pupils achieving five or more A* - C grades was recorded.

Similarly, whilst we were delighted that the A Level tables, which do include our chosen qualifications, placed us second amongst the schools in the city based on the average point score per pupil, we always recognise that many of our students worked exceptionally hard to achieve grades which were not so high in absolute terms, but which represented a great achievement for them as individuals. We are as keen to celebrate their achievements as we are to celebrate those of pupils with the highest exam grades.
