become friends. Speaking on the
subject of forgiveness Richard
said: "There is no question, I am

a victim of violence and I have no control over that but I am not a victim of anger and I do have control of that." I 15 European students attended across the weekend and took part in a number of workshops, culminating in a brilliant presentation evening.



Down on the farm

Year I visited Whitehouse Farm in Northumberland as part of their work on animals and their young.

In the morning, students were shown the outdoor animals and fed goats, sheep, horses and llamas. In the afternoon students played in the adventure playground and went on a tractor ride through a field full of cows.

We were thrilled with our exam results again this Summer. Our GCSE results were the best the school has ever achieved with a remarkable 29 students achieving all A*and A grades and the girls' results were the best in the schools' history. At A level 18 students achieved the outstanding results of all A*and A grades. For five of the last eight years Dame Allan's has been the top performing school in Newcastle in the Government's league tables for A-levels, based on the average A-level point score per pupil. This year DASPA was delighted to agree funding to provide technology in the form of iPads to the PE department mainly as a selfassessment tool for the pupils, helping students to analyse their own performance. Provision of a thermal-imaging camera has helped enthuse the students and support their understanding in the sciences.
