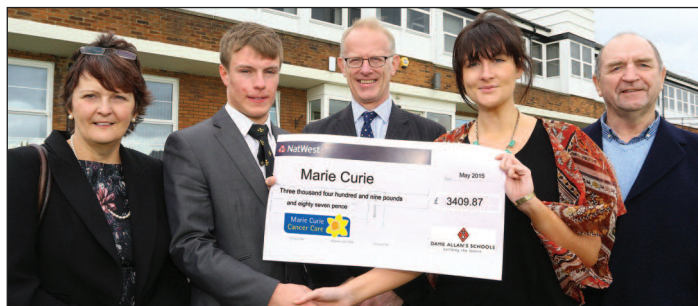

Charity 'rugby' ball

We came together in a special assembly this half term to present Marie Curie Care with a cheque for over £3,000 in memory of Allanian Richard Holmes. We presented an impressive £3,409.87 much of which was raised through rugby matches in memory of Richard who was a keen sportsman, playing rugby for Dame Allan's, Northumbria University and Northern FC, and was sadly just 24 years old when he died of a brain tumour in 2013. The matches have been a huge success over the last two years, with Allanians coming together to play an Under 25 v Over 25 match to

remember Richard and raise money for Marie Curie, which looked after him in his final days. Dr Hind, Katie Searles, Marie Curie Community Fundraiser and Richard's mother, Mrs Linda Holmes all spoke at the assembly, both on how the money will be used and to pay tribute to Richard. A further donation of over £3,000 is to be sent to South Africa for Pecanwood College and its partner outreach school Re-e-lwele. We have supported the schools for a number of years and Richard visited them on a rugby tour with Dame Allan's.

Wastwater visit

This term our Year 5 children went on a residential trip to Wastwater in the Lake District. They had a fantastic time, with activities including open canoeing, ghyll scrambling, orienteering, team building and bushcraft activities. The aim of the residential trip is to help prepare Year 5 children to take on more responsibilities in their role as senior pupils in Year 6 of the Junior School.



Not just a Spectator

It was with great pleasure that we welcomed former pupil and managing editor of The Spectator, Sebastian Payne to the Schools. Seb spoke to some of our Sixth Form politics pupils, offering advice and answering questions on his time working for The Washington Post. Seb also spoke to our debating club about his work on The Spectator and launched the Schools' Mock General Election 2015, really inspiring our pupils to engage in politics.

Dance class

Our school dance show saw mesmerising performances including powerful choreography from a member of the nationally renowned BalletBoyz at Newcastle's Dance City. Edward Pearce is in his fifth season with the innovative ballet troupe and choreographed a piece for Jeune which explored different kinds of love and enabled the young dancers to express themselves through a series of solo performances. Other pieces performed included 'Birds of Paradise', which Jeune will perform alongside VizaVis, the Schools' senior dance group, as one of only four groups in the UK at the U.dance

National Festival later in 2015. Providing yet more inspiration for our young performers, Allnian Ellis Saul returned as a guest choreographer. Ellis began her dance career at Dame Allan's, going on to achieve a scholarship at the London Contemporary Dance School where she created choreography which has been performed at the Royal Opera House. The spectacular show was named Visjeun89, after the Schools' principal dance companies, VizaVis and Jeune, and the year that Head of Dance Lynda Clough joined Dame Allan's. Clough will choreograph for the Schools, as she retires in the Summer after 26 years.

Saatchi & McBride



We were thrilled that Sixth Form student Niamh McBride was shortlisted for the 2015 Saatchi Gallery / Deutsche Bank Art Prize for Schools. Niamh's piece, 'Order from Chaos' was selected from over 20,000 art works and was on display in the Saatchi Gallery in London between April and May. 'Order from Chaos' is a collection of 96 photographic images

presented as an A5 concertina style book. iPad manipulated images illustrate the magnetic properties and resulting pattern values in iron filings and explore the interface between science and art. The piece is inspired by the work of contemporary artists Richard Wright and Stefan Kurten. This is a fantastic achievement for Niamh – well done.



We are very proud of our Eco-Panel. As a result of their work, and after a successful inspection, we have been re-awarded the prestigious Eco-Schools England Green Flag for a further two years. Well done to them all – keep up the good work!
