



After yet another fantastic year in 2017, we look ahead to another exciting 12 months at Dame Allan's Schools. While we are only one month into the new year, much has already happened in our Junior and Senior Schools and I hope this is a sign of things to come throughout 2018. Our Sixth Form students and pupils in Year 11 have been working hard through their trial examinations, preparing for the summer as they look to continue Dame Allan's excellent success rate in public examinations, which I am fully confident they will do. The league tables recently published by the Department for Education might appear to be a cast iron measure of that success, but the picture is much more complicated. As ever the tables do not recognise the Schools' chosen IGCSE qualifications in maths and English meaning that Dame Allan's position in a table measuring performance rates in GCSEs including maths and English is normally at the bottom, along

with some other independent schools who follow IGCSE courses. The results in this year's tables are even more complex as Dame Allan's figures do include the data for those students who came to us from Sunderland High School following its closure in summer 2016, as they were following GCSE courses in maths and English and continued to do so after they joined Dame Allan's. As a consequence, because a small minority of our school cohort did GCSE examinations, their results do appear in the league tables, leaving us with an even more misleading figure than usual which shows that only five per cent of Dame Allan's students achieved passes in five GCSEs including maths and English. This is no criticism of the students who joined us from Sunderland High; they worked hard in Dame Allan's, they showed real resilience in difficult circumstances and they were a credit throughout to themselves and their former school. It is, however, yet another reflection on the inadequacy of league tables as a real measure of school performance.

At A Level our results were again some of the best in the region

with the average point score coming out as a B grade, an improvement on last year. Well done to all pupils and staff for their hard work.

And of course, any measure of school success can and must look beyond academic results. It was pleasing to see so many pupils' achievements recognised in the recent Outdoor Learning Education (OLED) Awards for example. The numerous certificates handed out are testament to the time and effort dedicated by our young people, frequently to serving others as well as developing their own skill sets. Similarly, we were proud of the success of our fantastic dance show at Newcastle's Dance City, with students from Year 6 to Year 13 bringing the house down with excellent performances. This term brought us the sad news that our bursar Mrs Lant will be leaving us after four-anda-half years. She has been a fantastic asset to Dame Allan's during that time and leaves the Schools in a considerably stronger position than they were on her arrival. We wish her all the very best as she undertakes an exciting new challenge in the coming weeks.





Stars shine outdoors

More than 100 of our pupils took centre stage as they collected certificates and prizes during our recent Outdoor Learning Education (OLED) Awards ceremony in school.

The youngsters have achieved various awards out of school hours with their dedication and sense of adventure seeing them rewarded with Duke of Edinburgh, Mountain Skills and Hill Skills awards, as well as climbing and sailing awards.

While it is very rare for people so young to gain their Gold Duke of Edinburgh Awards, we were proud that four current Sixth Formers had already gained the coveted achievement, which takes a great deal of commitment over a 12-month spell. The pupils and their parents were also inspired by an interesting presentation by Clive Gray, the chief executive of Blyth Tall Ships, who came into school to talk about his past adventures and upcoming voyages including an expedition to Antarctica. Year 13 pupil Anna left with the main prize of the Outstanding Contribution to Outdoor Education after gaining her Mountain Skills Award, going on the Schools' World Challenge trip to Costa Rica and Nicaragua and currently working towards her Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Following his gold medal at the event, he and 18 other students from Dame Allan's qualified for the Northumberland event, held at Temple Park, South Shields. Dan was then joined by Will (Year 8), Kieron (Year 9) and Will (Year 12) at the inter-counties round, all four representing Northumberland against runners from across the North East and Cumbria.

Rugby fund doubled

A grand total of £872 was raised for Marie Curie as two sets of old boys went head-to-head in the annual Richard Holmes Memorial rugby match at Kingston Park, the home of Newcastle Falcons. The game just before Christmas was switched to the Premiership club's stadium as the School's grass pitches were frozen. On the day, £436 was raised and that total was doubled when the school received a matched donation. A team of over 25s went head-tohead with a group of players aged under 25 in memory of former pupil Richard whose passion for sport continues to inspire the event years after his death in 2013. Victory in a hard fought game was secured by the over 25s. Unfortunately, the old girls' hockey match scheduled for the same day was cancelled due to a frozen pitch!
