In Conversation with... Mrs Clough, Exams Officer

As our Exams Officer, you're just coming out of a very busy period! Can you give us a snapshot of your day-to-day role both before and during exam weeks?

During exam times it is very busy, sometimes you are juggling so many things. I have a good team of invigilators who help me and keep me sane. Day-to-day when exams are on, it is setting up the exams and making sure all the invigilation team know what's going on, then making sure all papers are sent to the exam boards.

Before and after exam times is just as important. I am usually busy planning, and liaising with department heads to make sure entries are all in place.

What is your favourite part of your role?

Probably in July when the season is over and you can sit back and relax! Also, it's wonderful on results days when everything comes together.

How did you get into this area? Have you always worked within schools?

I have worked in schools since 2007, I actually sort of fell into the role when looking for a change of career. Previously, I worked for a car dealership after finishing my degree in Media Studies at Sunderland University.

You're relatively new to Dame Allan's, what were your first impressions of the Schools?

The Schools are totally different from other schools I have worked at. They are much more calm and the pupils are so much more polite. The pupils are articulate, patient, and ambitious. The staff here are also willing to help and are very supportive.

And finally, what top tips would you give our pupils on how to best prepare for an exam day?

I would say:

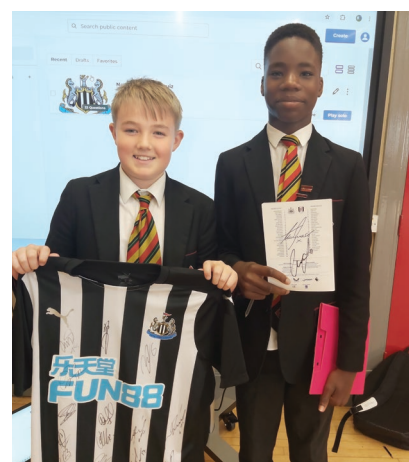
Hadrian's Wall

Safeguarding - Safer Gaming

With the long summer break ahead of us, many children and teens will be looking forward to spending some time on their consoles and computers, getting lost in a game.

Online chat is a big part of the gaming world and can help build friendship bonds - your child might currently speak to their friends on Fortnite or Minecraft - but there is an area where chat can turn more worrying.

Chats can take the form of text, voice, or sometimes even video. They can be inbuilt into the games, or held via a third party app that integrates directly into the gaming experience. Some key elements to be aware of are:

- **Exposure to bad language or online hate.** Some games filter swearing and other hate speech out, but this is very hard to police through mediums such as voice chat.
- **Grooming.** Sadly, gaming platforms are a popular choice for predators to approach and attempt to groom children and teens. Red flags to watch out for are

strangers repeatedly chatting to your child, requests for photos or personal information, and requests to take the chat onto a third party platform, such as a social media network or WhatsApp.

- **Cyberbullying.** Using a digital chat platform unfortunately can lead to instances of cyberbullying, especially during competitive games where emotions may be heightened. Being able to hide behind characters or avatars in a game can sometimes embolden people to be cruel in a way that they would never consider in 'real life'.

So, what is the best way to support your child to game in a safe way? Dependent on their age, you can:

- For younger children, research and choose games with a closed chat, where they can only talk to people they know. Check the privacy settings on each game to see how you can tailor chats to your child.

- Remind your child that they should only be talking about the game, should someone they don't know chat to them. If the conversation gets unpleasant, worrying, or they ask for personal information or photos, ensure your child knows to not engage. Make sure they know they can always talk to you about anything they experience online - clear, non-judgemental communication is key.
- Ensure that children are aware of how to block and report other users.
